## Necessity of The Hope of Survivors

While the following quote was used in our 2006 annual report, we felt it significant enough to include it again here. *“Ninety-six percent of sexual exploitation by professionals involves a man in power capitalizing on a woman’s trust. Clergy sexual misconduct happens when a person in a ministerial role engages in sexual contact, threats or sexual behavior with a congregant, client, employee, student, staff member, colleague or volunteer. Sometimes it’s done once, spontaneously, by a leader who is emotionally vulnerable and lonely. Other times, the abuse happens from a leader who has a pattern of abusing power—a serial abuser who actively looks for opportunities to take advantage of congregants.”*—Phil Strickland, [excerpt from a letter of introduction for *Broken Trust: Confronting Clergy Sexual Misconduct*]

**“And you shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free.”**  
—John 8:32

Over the last five years, The Hope of Survivors has heard from hundreds of victims of pastoral sexual abuse. Their lives are shattered and they need hope. Recently, we received a phone call from a victim who had just discovered the web site. She said, *“I felt lost and alone and I was suicidal, so I started searching the Internet. The Hope of Survivors is what saved my life.”* God has literally used The Hope of Survivors to prevent victims from taking their own lives. And, she’s not the only one. Listen to another victim who wrote, *“I know any change for the good is attributed to yours and Steve’s prayers for us, I am certain there is no one else doing it. So I thank you from the bottom of my heart, because I know that prayer is what changes things. I will be so glad to do something generous for you. You are one of a kind. I thank you for being who you are. ...both my therapist and psychiatrist think it will be important for me to gain back a sense of power, healing and validation. But I know I owe everything to you and Steve. It has been you two and this ministry that has opened my eyes to so very many things. Otherwise I would have been a lot worse off than I am now, having to live with this alone, and placing the blame totally upon myself.”*

Indeed, it is the truth that sets people free.

Contrary to the long-standing belief of some, children are not the only victims of clergy, and the vast majority of women attending church are not trying to see if they can “take down” their popular and charismatic pastor. Sadly, too often, it is the much-loved, outgoing, likeable pastor who masquerades as a shepherd of the flock but who, in reality, turns out to be a wolf in sheep’s clothing. No, we do not deny there are a few women who may intentionally set out to destroy a pastor and his ministry for some reason. However, the vast majority of the time, it is the pastor who sets his sights on a vulnerable woman in his congregation and lures her into a web of deceit in order to take advantage of her. It’s time the Church—the Body of Believers—learns to recognize its responsibility to those who have been harmed by clergy. God is not mocked, and He has given us ample warnings in His Word for situations just like this. 1 Samuel 2:22 states, *“Now Eli was very old, and heard all that his sons did unto all Israel; and how they lay with the women that assembled at the door of the tabernacle of the congregation.”* As Eli speaks to his sons, the priests of the House of God, he makes it clear to them that they are the ones causing the Lord’s people to transgress (verse 24). The pastor (or any spiritual leader) is always the one with the responsibility to maintain healthy and appropriate boundaries—at all times.

Pastoral sexual abuse is an ever-increasing problem in congregations around the world, and in every denomination. The destruction in the victim’s life cannot be underestimated. The potential for health problems, suicide risk, and breaking up of marriages and families is just the beginning. One of the worst “side effects” of pastoral sexual abuse is the loss of faith, trust and relationship with God. Many victims find it impossible to return to their church—or any church. Yet, that’s not the worst of it. Too often, there are some who never recover from the abuse and remain away from God forever. The responsibility for that victim’s life lies in the hands of the pastor or spiritual leader who abused her (or him, as the case may sometimes be).



Those who abuse can be male or female. We've encountered both. However, the majority of offenders happen to be male. Victims come in all ages and include men and women, young and old. Some have kept this dark secret for decades, having been abused as a child or teen and not telling a soul about it until well in their seventies or eighties. Others plan to raise their families in church but, while turning to the pastor for help and spiritual guidance, they find themselves victims of an unscrupulous and unconsecrated pastor.

The collateral damage needs to be examined as well. Though the primary victim is most devastated, there are secondary victims and periphery victims who too often struggle in the aftermath of disclosure. The Church (or organization) needs to be aware of this far-reaching damage and provide relief and hope for those who have been deeply wounded.

The Hope of Survivors works diligently to encourage, edify and strengthen the victim's faith in God. It is a painstaking and slow process that requires much prayer, patience, understanding, empathy and love. By God's grace, healing will take place in each victim's life as she allows the Lord to strengthen her and set her free from the pain of abuse and betrayal.

## History of The Hope of Survivors

The year 2007 marked the five-year anniversary of The Hope of Survivors, which was born one evening in December 2002, as Steve and Samantha were reflecting upon their own experience of pastoral sexual abuse and the lack of resources that were available to help them understand and heal at that time. They felt compelled to develop a web site that would provide information and encouragement to anyone who may be searching for answers. Steve and Samantha felt that if “just one person” could be helped by the web site, then it would be well worth the effort and pain they had gone through. While Steve and Samantha's vision was limited in thinking “just one,” the Lord knew how many hurting people there were—suffering all alone and living without hope. As you will see in the remainder of this report, there are many “ones” out there who have been touched and blessed by the ministry of The Hope of Survivors. Truly, God does work all things together for good to those who love Him and are called according to His purpose. (Romans 8:28)



The Hope of Survivors has grown rapidly in its services since it began. It has an active and growing Board of Directors, Officers and Volunteer staff. It often serves as the only available, unbiased liaison between victims and appropriate civil, public or religious assistance. Its documents, including a series of informational brochures (in Spanish and English) and DVDs, are circulated worldwide. The Hope of Survivors is unique, as a multitude of national web sites now exist on the subject, but most either provide angry denunciation of various religious organizations, or they are associated with a particular religious sect and require that affiliation from their clients, or they address the problem from a purely humanistic psychological approach—leaving God and His power to heal entirely out of the equation. Many charge for their services, yet The Hope of Survivors has determined to keep its services free of charge to victims. The need for The Hope of Survivors' unique services and approach is evident. To God be the glory, what great things He has done!

## About The Hope of Survivors

Originally incorporated in California, and subsequently authorized to conduct affairs in the state of Illinois, The Hope of Survivors is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization dedicated to assisting victims of pastoral sexual abuse and misconduct of all denominations, as well as providing educational and informational materials and seminars to pastors and churches worldwide. Pastoral care is provided through The Hope of Survivors' separate pastoral division, *Calling the Faithful*.

Many positive changes took place in 2007 and The Hope of Survivors—Australia Division grew, as Arlagene Groves was added as a counselor. Irma Murray served as Vice President of the Latino division, *La Esperanza de los Sobrevivientes*, while Shyleene Rosado-Maldonado joined as a counselor for the Spanish-speaking victims. In late 2007, Hephzibah Akunga joined The Hope of Survivors, as she began its Kenya Division in Africa. Other divisions under development include: Youth, Scandinavia, Romania, Tanzania and Pastor's Wives. Professional memberships include: Adventist-laymen's Services & Industries (ASI), Outpost Centers International (OCI), and the American Association of Christian Counselors (AACC).



## Description of Mission, Services & Programs

The organization's purpose is to provide hope and healing in Christ through encouragement, Biblical counseling, support, referral, assistance, educational programs and information to victims of pastoral sexual abuse and misconduct. The organization, and its Officers, Directors, Volunteers and Employees, use the Bible as the standard of their beliefs and philosophies in all areas. The ministry seeks to:

- (a) Educate the victims, the clergy, the church body and the general public about pastoral sexual abuse and misconduct, the frequency of occurrences, the moral and social implications involved and the devastating consequences through national media, by disseminating brochures and other related materials, conducting educational and informational seminars, and by maintaining an up-to-date web site;
- (b) Conduct retreats and seminars specifically for the victims of pastoral sexual abuse and provide one-on-one counsel and support for the purpose of facilitating their healing and recovery, and helping them to gain a greater understanding of what has happened to them, giving them hope and encouragement, and restoring their faith in their Creator;
- (c) Work closely with churches that are dealing with the after-effects of an abuse situation for the purpose of helping them to understand the importance of providing a safe environment for all and for understanding the dynamics of pastoral sexual abuse so that the church and the victim are not further damaged in the after-math;
- (d) Provide pastoral training/educational seminars for the purpose of providing prevention information and encouragement, and to work closely with those who have violated their sacred trust and encourage them to make amends to their victims and to receive counseling.

In short, the mission of The Hope of Survivors may be summed up in the motto:

***Reaching the Hurting...*** Ministering to those who have suffered abuse at the hands of clergy.

***Calling the Faithful...*** Providing resources and support to church leadership to help them remain true to their high calling.

***Bridging the Gap...*** Leading the hurting to hope through a healing relationship with Christ.

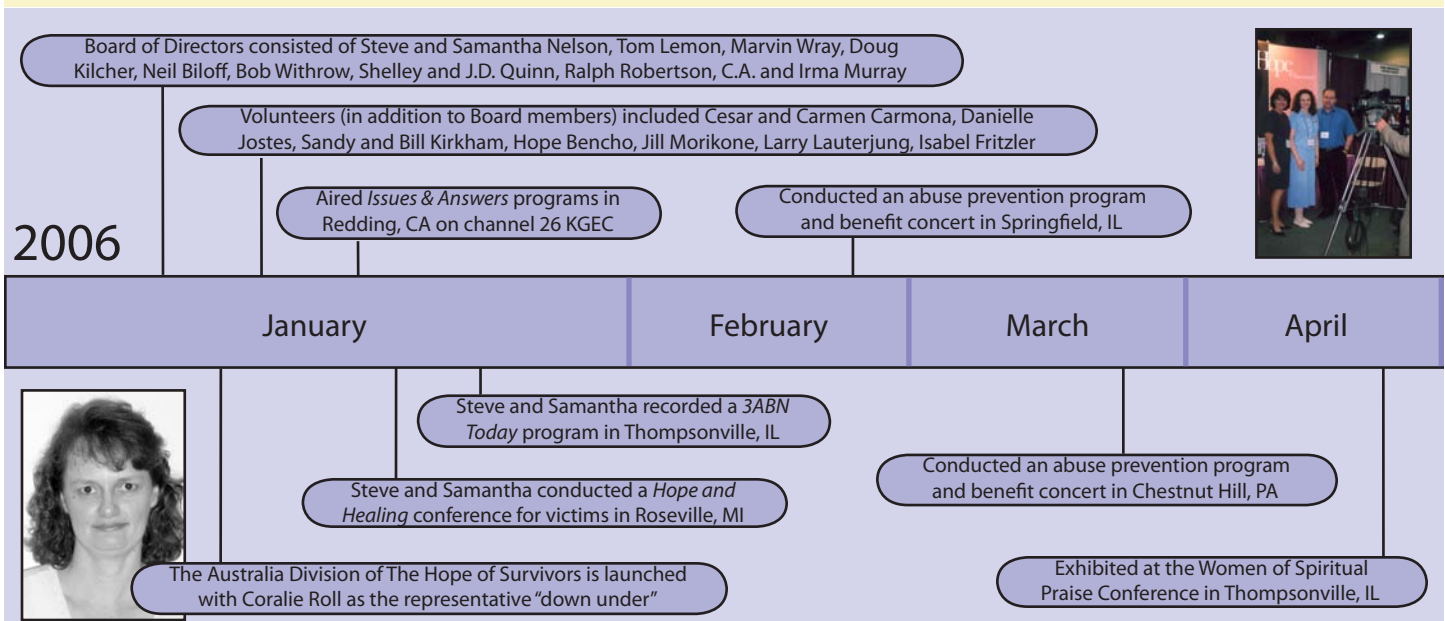

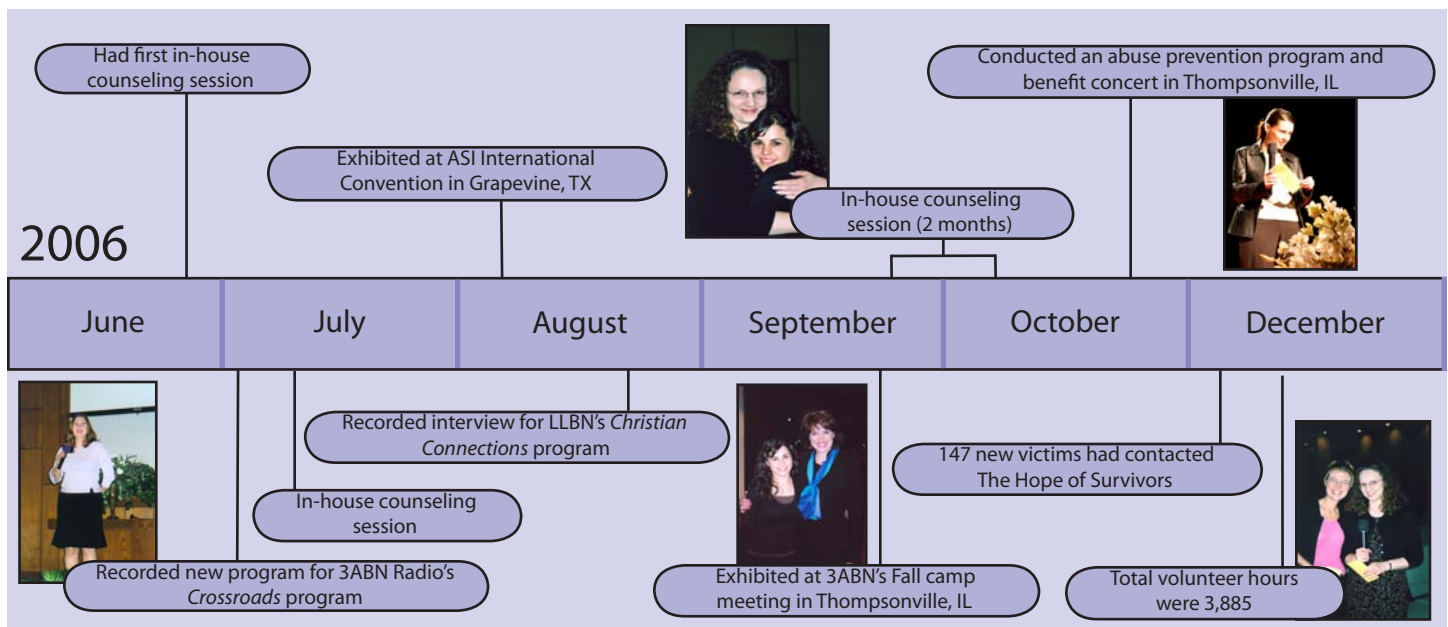

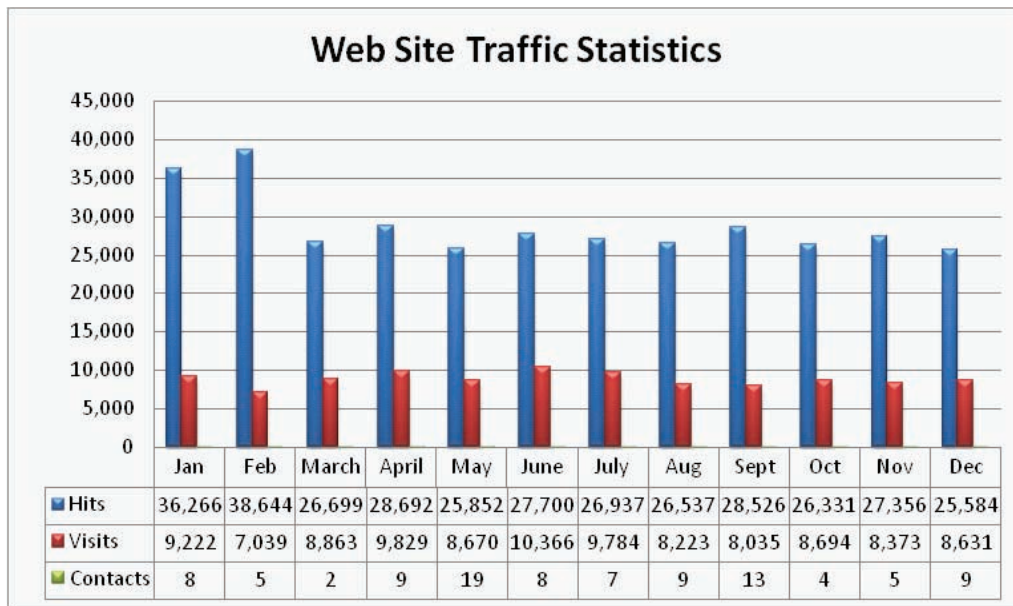

## Web Site Traffic Statistics

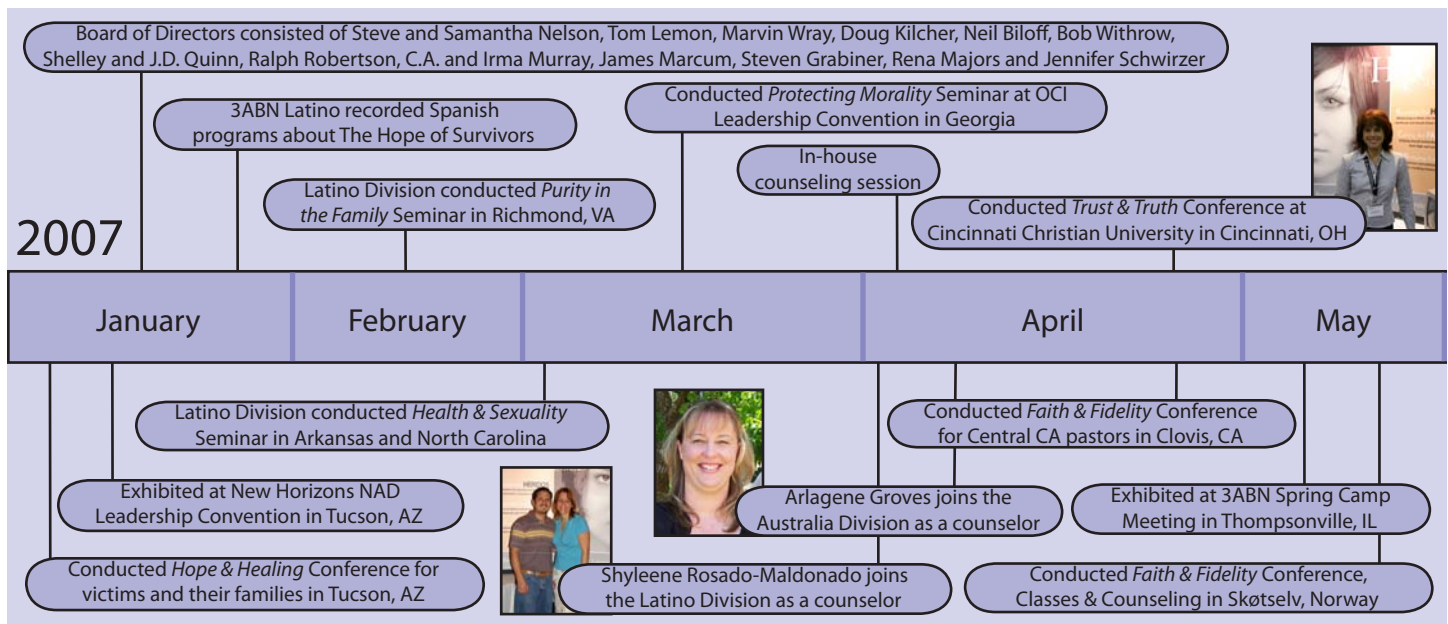
